<u>May Class: Iron Works Appliqué</u> Teacher: Joan Waldman

Supply List:

- Sewing machine (must have zig zag capabilities).
- Open toe applique foot or applique foot for your machine.
- #12 or #14 sewing machine needles (please bring several).
- Black thread for the top and bobbin thread to match your backing.
- Fabric scissors (that cut all the way to the tip).
- Paper scissors (preferably with a sharp point).
- Rotary cutting supplies.
- Ball point pen or a sharp pencil.
- Double stick scotch tape (sticky on top and bottom.)
- Sharpie "ultra fine line" marking pen.
- 505 basting spray (if you have it). I will have some available to try.

Fabric:

- 1 1/4 yd. black fabric. (good quality, washed and pressed).
- 2/3 yd. batik. (multi-color hand dye or bright busy print, your choice).
- 1 yd. fusible web. (be sure it is designed for sewing through-wonder under, steam a seam or your favorite
- 20" square cotton batting.





Meeting Minutes

Panhandle Quilt Guild April 19, 2008 Scottsbluff, Nebraska

Meeting was called to order by President Lori Sanders.

The regular meeting of the Panhandle Quilt Guild was called to order by President, Lori Sanders. After a welcome to all members and guests, Lori asked for corrections to the minutes, as printed in the newsletter. Hearing none, the minutes stand approved as printed. There were no questions or corrections to the treasurer's report and it will be filed with the audit committee. Jacci Irwin, Vice President, announced she would be glad to take names of interested members for next years' activities and committees. Joan Kennedy, Secretary, reported she had sent a condolence to Betty Weddell.

Reports of the Standing Committees are as follows:

- Sydney Roosa clarified some questions on the challenge, A Quilter's Life- Traditions Old and New, and the submission of entries for the quilt show. She also reminded members to sign up for quilt show committees with Carolyn Nuss-Warren after the meeting.
- Norma Wells, for the silent auction, asked for more donations and was available after the meeting.
- Barb Engebretsen reported that the refreshment committees are in place and will be listed in the newsletter each month.
- Tricia Schmunk announced there are more raffle tickets that can be sold and reminded members to turn in the signed tickets for the drawing.
- The Quilt Show Committee reminded entrants for the quilt show to pick up a three-part registration form, submit the form to Sharon Cripps as soon as possible, and keep the pink copy on the back of the form so that it can be attached to the lower, left hand back of the quilt when it is entered in the show.
- Sharon Armstrong announced there are a few openings left for the May class with Joan Waldman.
- The Serendipity quilt for next year is being completed by Anita Allen and will be presented at the quilt show. Anita said work is progressing well and the quilt is called "Panhandle Sunrise".
- The Block of the Month members presented the appliqué block for May, a butterfly in reproduction fabrics. The drawing for the April block with Civil War fabrics was held for two sets of sixteen blocks each. Barb Katen won the first set, Barb Engebretsen won the second set, Jody Meer won the consolation prize.
- The door prize drawing was held and is listed after the minutes.
- Dianna Hatch, membership chairman, announced 2008-2009membership dues for the upcoming year can be paid. Dues will remain at \$25.00, which includes 10 raffle tickets to keep or sell.




REMINDER!

Dear American Hero Quilt ladies,

My name is Ranae Last week at the Warrior Transition Battalion you presented my son with a hero quilt. I am writing to tell you about my son and that quilt. My son did not want to come and get a quilt. His Sgt. said they had to make it an order that he come down to the common room. He was one of the last to receive a quilt as you were packing up. Perhaps you remember him, he is the very quiet man with the haunted eyes. On Friday he had rather extensive surgery with several bone grafts and skin grafts. My husband and I were stunned when he appeared at the hospital with

his quilt. He has not shown an interest in anything or anyone since he was injured. The last thing he asked before they wheeled him away was that we keep his quilt with us and make sure nothing happened to it. When he woke up his first words to us were not how glad he was to see us, it was "do you have my quilt?" He asked that it was immediately put on him, he said that he was cold.

I have been thinking a lot about that quilt and my son. We thought we had lost him emotionally and we despaired of ever getting him back. He was not connecting with anyone in our family, not even his nephew who he has adored since our little guy was born. This

quilt seems to give him comfort, warmth and is the first sigh that maybe our son will come back to us. This quilt is clearly something that you spent a great deal of time on. I just wanted to let you know that to us, this quilt is hope ant to our son it is priceless. Thank you so much for the honor you have done to my son. From our family, thank you for helping bring our son back to us.

Check This Out:

A Book Review from the PQG Library

The Appliqué Handbook by Becky Goldsmith and Linda Jenkins

Appliqué quilts are intriguing. They capture the nuances of a scene, the feel of the moment, the shared message, the humor of the pun, etc. With the execution of flawless technique and the right explosion of color, the result is a quilt of incomparable beauty. On one hand, they are works of pictorial art that draw the viewer in. On the other hand, they are daunting projects for people, like me, who find them intimidating.

Where do you start? How do you know what makes a good design? How can you create a pieced background that doesn't take away from the appliqué? How do you create curves and inner points that aren't bumpy and pointy?

The authors cover all topics thoroughly, and emphasize that careful planning is key to making a quilt that doesn't disappoint the maker. Fabrics need to be evaluated on a design wall and substitutions and changes are to be made liberally until the quilter is satisfied with overall effect.

Using laminates to cover the design pieces that are replicated on a copy machine assures the maker that shapes are accurate and the pattern pieces are flexible and sturdy.

Everything you need to know to make your quilt outstanding is covered in this book, which includes a pattern for a practice piece.

If you are interested in learning more, check out www.pieceocake.com. I'm looking forward to meeting Becky Goldsmith, one of the quilt world's many innovators, at the State Convention in Chadron.
