


All of the Quilt Shops and merchants were thanked for their generous door prize donations. Please remember to tell them Thank you by note, phone call or e-mail.

SEPTEMBER CLASS SIGN VPS

Just a reminder of the Standing Rules regarding class sign ups:

First, if the class fee is \$15 or less, the full amount must be paid at the time of sign up. Classes which cost more than \$15 require a 50% deposit at sign up and must be paid in full at least one month prior to class in order to remain on class list. No reimbursement will be allowed except in case of an emergency, with reason submitted to the Advisory Board in writing, and approved by the membership.

Second, if, at the September meeting, the class exceeds teacher's maximum allowed participants, a lottery will be held at that meeting for class participants, and the order on the waiting list. In order to implement this change, class sign ups will be handled as follows:

Members will pay for all classes as per Standing Rules, at the time of sign up. If a class **does** exceed the maximum; once the business meeting begins, a lottery will be conducted by the Program Coordinator and one other PQG member. The Program Coordinator will announce, during the meeting, those members who will be placed on the waiting list. They will then need to contact the Program Coordinator before leaving the meeting, to adjust their class payment.

After the September meeting, there will be no lotteries, and anyone signing up to be on the **waiting list** of a class that has filled, will not pay the class fee at sign up.
